## Director's Statement



I am thrilled to present my first dramatic film as a director, after spending more than three decades as a film technician and educator. This film is the result of a personal journey that started 6 years ago when I moved to Ottawa, Canada. A city with a growing film community and potential. There, I had the opportunity to mentor young filmmakers and share my knowledge and experience with them. But I also realized that I still had a burning desire to tell my own stories. Stories that resonate with me and reflect my values and vision.

My stories are about women who face challenges such as hopelessness, despair, and low self-worth, but who find hope and love in unexpected ways. They are character-driven stories that explore how love can transform lives and bring healing and happiness. The Funeral is one of those stories.

On the surface, this film is about a little girl and the loss of a pet that she had neglected and the process of burial. The subtext is a much deeper theme: how to heal from hurting others. Even with the best of intentions, our actions can cause pain for others and accepting responsibility for those actions is the only way we can heal, not only the ones we hurt, but also, ourselves. I hope the audience feels moved by this story as I did.

I am grateful for the chance to make this film and to work with a talented cast and crew who supported my vision. I am also thankful for the passionate filmmakers that sparked my passion for filmmaking again. I believe that mentorship is essential for the development of the film industry and the growth of new voices and perspectives. I hope that this film will be a testament to the power of mentorship and storytelling.
